SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF

22 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

Article 88A - Department of Human Resources

- 3 (A) THE DEPARTMENT OF HUMAN RESOURCES SHALL REQUEST AND THE
- 4 GOVERNOR SHALL PROVIDE IN THE STATE BUDGET THE ADDITIONAL POSITIONS OF
- 5 QUALIFIED CASEWORKERS AND CASEWORK SUPERVISORS NECESSARY TO ATTAIN
- 6 APPROPRIATE CASELOAD RATIOS FOR CHILD PROTECTIVE SERVICES, FAMILY
- 7 PRESERVATION, FOSTER CARE, KINSHIP CARE, AND PREADOPTION CASES AS
- 8 OUTLINED IN SECTION 2 OF CHAPTER 544 OF THE ACTS OF THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY
- 9 OF 1998. CASELOAD RATIOS IN ALL JURISDICTIONS THAT DO NOT EXCEED:
- 10 (1) 12 CASES PER CASEWORKER IN CHILD PROTECTIVE SERVICES;
- 11 (2) 15 CASES PER CASEWORKER IN FOSTER CARE, KINSHIP CARE, GROUP
- 12 CARE, AND RESIDENTIAL CARE CASES; AND
- 13 (3) 8 CASEWORKERS PER SUPERVISOR.
- 14 (B) (1) THE SECRETARY OF HUMAN RESOURCES AND THE SECRETARY OF
- 15 BUDGET AND MANAGEMENT SHALL DEVELOP THE APPROPRIATE CASELOAD RATIOS
- 16 USING THE RATIO RECOMMENDATIONS OF THE CHILD WELFARE LEAGUE OF
- 17 AMERICA IN ITS 1997 REPORT, "A REPORT OF THE MARYLAND CHILD WELFARE
- 18 SYSTEM".
- 19 (2) THE RELEVANT CASELOAD RATIOS FOR THE 24 JURISDICTIONS
- 20 SHALL BE DEVELOPED FROM THE 1997 CHILD WELFARE LEAGUE REPORT.
- 21 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the Governor shall
- 22 include in the annual State operating budgets for fiscal years 2002 and 2003 2002,
- 23 2003, and 2004 sufficient funds in each fiscal year to reduce, in equal shares,
- 24 proportionally phase in, in each jurisdiction, the caseload-to-staff ratios for Child
- 25 Protective Services, Family Preservation, Foster Care, Kinship Care and Preadoption
- 26 Cases to meet the objectives for easeload reduction as outlined in Section 2 of Chapter
- 27 544 of the Acts of the General Assembly of 1997 child protective services, foster care,
- 28 kinship care, group care, and residential care cases that are required by this Act.
- 29 SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That, on or before January 1
- 30 and July 1 of calendar years 2001 through 2003 2004 and January 1, 2004 2005, and
- 31 subject to § 2-1246 of the State Government Article, the Department of Human
- 32 Resources and the Department of Budget and Management shall provide to the
- 33 Senate Budget and Taxation Committee, the Senate Finance Committee, and the
- 34 House Appropriations Committee progress reports on the achievement of the
- 35 appropriate required caseload ratios.
- 36 SECTION 4. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
- 37 July 1, 2000.
