RESOLUTION NO. 11

1 A House Joint Resolution concerning

2 **Judicial Compensation Commission Report**

3 FOR the purpose of ~~proposing an alteration to the compensation of~~ providing that the  
4 members of the Judiciary in this State, ~~pursuant to Section 1-708 of the Courts~~  
5 ~~and Judicial Proceedings Article of the Annotated Code of Maryland~~ shall receive  
6 a general salary increase on a certain date if a general salary increase is provided  
7 to State employees in certain fiscal years; and generally relating to judicial  
8 compensation.

9 WHEREAS, Section 1-708(b)(2) of the Courts and Judicial Proceedings Article  
10 of the Annotated Code of Maryland establishes a 7-member Judicial Compensation  
11 Commission appointed by the Governor with 2 members appointed on nomination of  
12 the President of the Senate, 2 members appointed on nomination of the Speaker of  
13 the House of Delegates, 1 member appointed on nomination of the Maryland State  
14 Bar Association, and 2 members appointed at large. The Judicial Compensation  
15 Commission is constituted as follows: appointments made on the nomination of the  
16 President of the Senate: John Paterakis and Elizabeth Buck Behney; appointments  
17 made on the nomination of the Speaker of the House of Delegates: Laurence Levitan  
18 and Charles R. Jenkins, Sr.; appointment made on the nomination of the Maryland  
19 Bar Association: J. Michael Conroy, Jr.; appointments at large: Elizabeth S. Morrison

1 and Alice G. Pinderhughes. The Commission members elected Laurence Levitan  
2 Chairman; and

3 WHEREAS, Section 1-708(d) of the Courts and Judicial Proceedings Article of  
4 the Annotated Code of Maryland provides as follows: the General Assembly may  
5 amend this Joint Resolution to decrease any of the Commission's salary  
6 recommendations, but no reduction may diminish the salary of a judge during the  
7 judge's continuance in office. The General Assembly may not amend this Joint  
8 Resolution to increase these recommended salaries. Should the General Assembly not  
9 adopt or amend this Joint Resolution within 50 days of its introduction, the salaries  
10 recommended herein shall apply during fiscal year 2001. Should the General  
11 Assembly reject any or all of the salaries herein recommended, the salaries of the  
12 judges so affected shall remain unchanged during fiscal year 2001 unless modified  
13 under other provisions of the law; and

14 WHEREAS, The Judicial Compensation Commission held several meetings in  
15 November and December 1999. The Commission considered many aspects and facets  
16 of judicial compensation. The Commission by a vote of 5 or more of its members has  
17 recommended judicial salaries for fiscal year 2001; now, therefore, be it

18 RESOLVED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That after  
19 considering the recommendations of the Judicial Compensation Commission,  
20 beginning July 1, 2000, judicial salaries shall be as follows:

23 *and 2002, each judge shall receive the general salary increase in accordance with §*  
24 *1-703(b) of the Courts and Judicial Proceedings Article on the same date the increase*  
25 *is effective for State employees.*
