House Bill 1122 (Delegates Montague and Cole)

Environmental Matters

Juvenile Justice - Department of Health and Mental Hygiene - Monitoring Injuries at Juvenile Facilities

This bill requires the Department of Health and Mental Hygiene (DHMH) to monitor incidences of physical injury sustained by children at juvenile facilities operated by the Department of Juvenile Justice (DJJ).

DHMH must submit an annual report of its findings and any recommendations to the General Assembly by December 30 of each year.

The bill takes effect July 1, 2000 and sunsets June 30, 3005.

Fiscal Summary

State Effect: General fund expenditures increase by \$61,700 in FY 2001 to hire a nurse. Future year expenditures reflect salary increases and inflation.

Analysis

Current Law: DHMH is not required to monitor incidences of physical injury sustained by children in DJJ facilities.

Background: Serious concerns have been raised about conditions and practices in DJJ facilities, including allegations of physical abuse of juvenile residents.

State Expenditures: During July and August 1999, 30 injuries of children at DJJ facilities were reported each month. It is expected that the number of injuries would be reduced in the future. DHMH advises that it would need to hire two nurses to meet the bill's requirements. Legislative Services believes, however, that one nurse could handle the additional work.

General fund expenditures thus would increase by an estimated \$61,674 in fiscal 2001, which reflects the bill's July 1, 2000 effective date. The estimate includes salary for the new nurse, fringe benefits, one-time office equipment purchases, communications, travel, and supplies.

Future year expenditures reflect (1) 4.5% annual salary increases and 3% employee turnover; and (2) 1% annual increases in ongoing operating expenses.
