# FISCAL NOTE

Senate Bill 144 (Senator Kellev. *et al.*) Judicial Proceedings

#### Family Law - Denial of Unsupervised Visitation - Sexual Offenses and Child Abuse

This bill prohibits a court from awarding unsupervised visitation with a child to a noncustodial parent who has been found guilty of incest, rape, a sexual offense against a child, or child abuse.

The bill applies only to convictions imposed on or after the bill's October 1, 2000, effective date.

### Analysis

**Current Law:** Sections 9-101 and 9-101.1 of the Family Law Article require a court to take evidence of abuse into consideration when making a child custody or visitation determination.
