Senate Joint Resolution 5 (Senator Pinsky, *et al.*)

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**Health Care for All Marylanders**

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This joint resolution provides that the Maryland General Assembly is committed to implementing public policy that will provide affordable, quality health care coverage for all Marylanders and that a public/private partnership is encouraged. This joint resolution establishes a Panel on Comprehensive Health Care to study the best approaches to providing affordable, quality health care coverage for all Marylanders and to report its findings to the Governor and the General Assembly by December 1, 2001. The Maryland Health Care Commission will staff the panel.

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**Fiscal Summary**

**State Effect:** Any expense reimbursements for the panel members and staffing costs for the Maryland Health Care Commission are assumed to be minimal and absorbable within existing budgeted resources.

**Local Effect:** None.

**Small Business Effect:** None.

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**Analysis**

**Current Law:** There is no provision for a panel to study comprehensive health care for all Marylanders. The Maryland Health Care Foundation is a nonprofit organization established to promote public awareness of the need to provide more timely and cost-effective care for Marylanders without health insurance and to receive moneys that can be used to provide financial support to programs that expand access to health care services for uninsured Marylanders.
