2 **Baltimore City *and the City of Annapolis* Parking Authority Authorities -**
3 **Drivers of Vehicles Registered Out of State Residential - Parking Permits**

4 FOR the purpose of authorizing the Executive Director of the Baltimore City Parking
5 Authority to issue a residential parking permit to a ~~property owner who is a~~
6 ~~driver of a vehicle not registered in the State under certain circumstances~~
7 person who owns and occupies residential property in the residential parking
8 permit area regardless of whether the person would otherwise qualify for the
9 permit under certain provisions of law; *authorizing the Annapolis Parking and*
10 *Fines section of the Annapolis Police Department to issue a residential parking*
11 *permit to a person who owns and occupies residential property in the residential*
12 *parking permit area regardless of whether the person would otherwise qualify for*
13 *the permit under certain provisions of law;* and generally relating to residential

4 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
 5 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

8 (a) [A] EXCEPT AS PROVIDED IN ~~SUBSECTION~~ SUBSECTIONS (B) (C) AND (D)
 9 OF THIS SECTION, A local authority may not issue a residential parking permit to the
 10 owner of a vehicle to be valid for a period in excess of 30 days unless the owner
 11 provides satisfactory evidence that:

12 (1) The vehicle for which the parking permit is sought is registered in
 13 the State; or

14 (2) The owner of the vehicle has obtained under § 13-402.1 of this
 15 article:

16 (i) A nonresident permit; or

17 (ii) A complimentary guest card.

1 ~~(E)~~ If a residential parking permit area is established as a result of the
2 construction of a professional sports facility that seats 45,000 or more people, a local
3 authority may not charge a fee for the issuance of a permit to park in that area.

4 (C) IN BALTIMORE CITY, THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR OF THE BALTIMORE CITY
5 PARKING AUTHORITY MAY ISSUE, ON A SHOWING OF EVIDENCE OF OWNERSHIP AND
6 OCCUPANCY, A RESIDENTIAL PARKING PERMIT TO A PERSON WHO OWNS AND
7 OCCUPIES RESIDENTIAL PROPERTY IN THE RESIDENTIAL PARKING PERMIT AREA
8 REGARDLESS OF WHETHER THE PERSON WOULD OTHERWISE QUALIFY FOR A
9 RESIDENTIAL PARKING PERMIT UNDER SUBSECTION (A) OF THIS SECTION.

10 (D) IN THE CITY OF ANNAPOLIS, THE ANNAPOLIS PARKING AND FINES
11 SECTION OF THE ANNAPOLIS POLICE DEPARTMENT MAY ISSUE, ON A SHOWING OF
12 EVIDENCE OF OWNERSHIP AND OCCUPANCY, A RESIDENTIAL PARKING PERMIT TO A
13 PERSON WHO OWNS AND OCCUPIES RESIDENTIAL PROPERTY IN THE RESIDENTIAL
14 PARKING PERMIT AREA REGARDLESS OF WHETHER THE PERSON WOULD
15 OTHERWISE QUALIFY FOR A RESIDENTIAL PARKING PERMIT UNDER SUBSECTION (A)
16 OF THIS SECTION.

17 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
