CHAPTER 65

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **State Board of Occupational Therapy Practice - Supervision of Aides**

3 FOR the purpose of authorizing the State Board of Occupational Therapy Practice to
4 enable a licensed occupational therapy assistant to supervise an unlicensed aide
5 under certain circumstances; altering the definition of a certain term; and
6 generally relating to the supervision of aides in the practice of occupational
7 therapy or limited occupational therapy.

18 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
19 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

Article - Health Occupations

2 10-101.

3 (a) In this title the following words have the meanings indicated.

4 (c) "Aide" means any individual who:

5 (1) Is not licensed by the Board to perform occupational therapy or
6 limited occupational therapy; and7 (2) Provides supportive services to the occupational therapist OR
8 OCCUPATIONAL THERAPY ASSISTANT under direct supervision.

9 10-301.

10 (a) Except as otherwise provided in this title, an individual shall be licensed
11 by the Board before the individual may practice occupational therapy or limited
12 occupational therapy in this State.

13 (b) This section does not apply to:

14 (1) An individual employed by the federal government as an
15 occupational therapist or an occupational therapy assistant, while practicing within
16 the scope of that employment;

17 (2) A student or trainee who is designated as a student or trainee, while:

18 (i) Fulfilling a field work requirement under § 10-302 of this
19 subtitle; or20 (ii) Pursuing a supervised course of study in an accredited or
21 approved educational program leading to a degree or certificate in:

22 1. Occupational therapy; or

23 2. Occupational therapy assistant;

24 (3) Subject to the regulations adopted by the Board, an aide who
25 supports the practice of occupational therapy OR THE PRACTICE OF LIMITED
26 OCCUPATIONAL THERAPY, if the aide:27 (i) Works only under the direct supervision of a licensed
28 occupational therapist OR OCCUPATIONAL THERAPY ASSISTANT and subject to the
29 occupational therapist's responsibility for supervision, as provided by this subtitle;
30 and31 (ii) Performs only support activities that do not require training in
32 the basic anatomical, biological, psychological, and social sciences used in the practice
33 of occupational therapy;

1 (4) An occupational therapist who is authorized to practice occupational
2 therapy in any other jurisdiction, if the occupational therapist practices occupational
3 therapy in this State for the purpose of educating, consulting, and training, for the
4 duration of the purpose, as preapproved by the Board; or

5 (5) An occupational therapy assistant who is authorized to practice
6 limited occupational therapy in any other jurisdiction, if the occupational therapy
7 assistant practices limited occupational therapy in this State for the purpose of
8 educating, consulting, and training, for the duration of the purpose, as preapproved
9 by the Board.

10 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
11 July 1, 2001.
