Budget and Taxation

Baltimore City - Goodwill Industries Loan of 2000

This bill authorizes the required matching fund for the Baltimore City – Goodwill Industries Loan of 2000 to consist of funds expended prior to June 1, 2000.

The bill is effective June 1, 2000.

Fiscal Summary

State Effect: Authorizing the matching fund to include previously expended moneys would not directly affect State finances.

Local Effect: None.

Small Business Effect: None.

Analysis

Current Law: Chapter 348 of 2000 authorized up to \$450,000 to the Board of Directors of Goodwill Industries of Baltimore, Inc. for the planning, design, repair, renovation, and capital equipping of a building on East Redwood Street in Baltimore City to be used as a career development center for Goodwill Industries. No part of the matching fund may consist of in kind contributions or funds expended prior to June 1, 2000.

Background: Goodwill Industries of the Chesapeake is a workforce development agency and network of businesses. Its mission is to provide career development, employment opportunities, and related social services to assist people with special needs to attain a better quality of life through work.

To date, Goodwill Industries has expended slightly over \$1 million on the project, approximately \$627,000 of which was expended prior to June 1, 2000.
