

- 20 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF

1 **Article - State Finance and Procurement** 2 14-301. 3 (a) In this subtitle the following words have the meanings indicated. 4 "Certification" means the determination that a legal entity is a minority (b) 5 business enterprise for the purposes of this subtitle. "Certification agency" means the agency designated by the Board of Public 6 (c) Works under § 14-303(b) of this subtitle to certify and decertify minority business enterprises AND TO DETERMINE SOCIALLY AND ECONOMICALLY DISADVANTAGED 9 INDIVIDUALS. 10 (d) "Certified minority business enterprise" means a minority business 11 enterprise that holds a certification. 12 "Economically disadvantaged individual" means a socially disadvantaged 13 individual whose ability to compete in the free enterprise system has been impaired 14 due to diminished capital and credit opportunities as compared to others in the same 15 or similar line of business who are not socially disadvantaged. "Minority business enterprise" means any legal entity, except a joint 16 (f) (1) 17 venture, that is: 18 (i) organized to engage in commercial transactions; 19 at least 51% owned and controlled by 1 or more individuals who (ii) 20 are socially and economically disadvantaged; and 21 managed by, and the daily business operations of which are (iii) 22 controlled by, one or more of the socially and economically disadvantaged individuals 23 who own it. 24 "Minority business enterprise" includes a not for profit entity 25 organized to promote the interests of physically or mentally disabled individuals. Subject to paragraphs (2) and (3) of this subsection, "personal net 27 worth" means the net value of the assets of an individual remaining after total 28 liabilities are deducted. 29 "Personal net worth" includes the individual's share of assets held 30 jointly or as community property with the individual's spouse. 31 (3)"Personal net worth" does not include: 32 the individual's ownership interest in the applicant or a (i) 33 certified minority business enterprise; or


