CHAPTER 290

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Creation of a State Debt - Maryland Consolidated Capital Bond Loan of 2002**  
3 **and the Maryland Consolidated Capital Bond Loans of 1970, 1991, 1992, 1994,**  
4 **1995, 1996, 1997, 1998, 1999, 2000, and 2001**

5 FOR the purpose of authorizing the creation of a State Debt in the amount of ~~Seven~~  
6 ~~Hundred Twenty Two Million, One Hundred Ninety Four Thousand Dollars~~  
7 ~~(\$722,194,000)~~ Seven Hundred Thirty-One Million, Fifty-Eight Thousand  
8 Dollars (\$731,058,000) the proceeds to be used for certain necessary building,  
9 construction, demolition, planning, renovation, conversion, replacement, and  
10 capital equipment purchases of this State, for acquiring certain real estate in  
11 connection therewith, and for grants to certain subdivisions and other  
12 organizations for certain purposes, subject to the requirement that certain  
13 grantees provide certain matching funds of a certain type by a certain date;  
14 providing generally for the issuance and sale of bonds evidencing the loan;  
15 providing for certain unexpended appropriations in prior capital budgets and  
16 bond loan acts to be expended for other public projects; altering certain  
17 requirements for certain programs in prior capital budget acts; making a

1 technical correction; providing that the authorizations of State Debt in certain  
2 prior capital budgets and bond loan acts be reduced by certain amounts;  
3 providing for certain additional information to be detailed about each project in  
4 the capital program; authorizing the creation of State debt to be issued in 2003,  
5 the proceeds to be used for the Morgan State University Library; and generally  
6 relating to the financing of certain capital projects.

17 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF  
18 MARYLAND, That:

19 (1) The Board of Public Works may borrow money and incur indebtedness on  
20 behalf of the State of Maryland through a State loan to be known as the Maryland  
21 Consolidated Capital Bond Loan of 2002 in the total principal amount of ~~\$722,194,000~~  
22 \$731,058,000. This loan shall be evidenced by the issuance, sale, and delivery of State  
23 general obligation bonds authorized by a resolution of the Board of Public Works and  
24 issued, sold, and delivered in accordance with Sections 8-117 through 8-124 of the  
25 State Finance and Procurement Article and Article 31, Section 22 of the Code.

26 (2) The bonds to evidence this loan or installments of this loan may be sold as  
27 a single issue of bonds under Section 8-122 of the State Finance and Procurement  
28 Article.

29 (3) The cash proceeds of the sale of the bonds shall be paid to the Treasurer  
30 and first shall be applied to the payment of the expenses of issuing, selling, and  
31 delivering the bonds, unless funds for this purpose are otherwise provided, and then  
32 shall be credited on the books of the Comptroller and expended, on approval by the  
33 Board of Public Works, for the following public purposes, including any applicable  
34 architects' and engineers' fees:
