CHAPTER 294

1 AN ACT concerning

Register of Wills - Salary

3 FOR the purpose of altering the maximum salary that the Board of Public Works may

4 set for a register of wills; repealing the minimum salary for a register of wills;

5 and providing that this Act does not apply to the salary or compensation of an

6 incumbent register of wills.

7 BY repealing and reenacting, without amendments,

17 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF

18 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

Article - Estates and Trusts

2 2-205.

3 (a) (1) It is the intent of this section that each register shall receive a fair
4 and adequate compensation for the effort and duties required of the register by the
5 register's office.

6 (2) The volume and character of work done by the register shall be in
7 comparison to the salary fixed by the Board of Public Works for each of the other
8 registers.

9 (b) (1) Each register is entitled to receive an annual salary of [not less than
10 \$6,000 and] not more than [\$75,000] \$85,000, to be determined in each instance by
11 the Board of Public Works.

12 (2) In determining the annual salary of the register, the Board of Public
13 Works shall be guided in the exercise of its discretion by:

14 (i) The population of the county determined by the last official
15 United States census;

16 (ii) The dollar volume of total fees and taxes collected and excess
17 fees turned over to the State for each of the preceding 5 years by the office of the
18 register for which the salary is being fixed; and

19 (iii) Other pertinent data which have relation to the reasonableness
20 of the salary in relation to the work done and volume handled by the office.

21 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That, pursuant to Article III,
22 Section 35 of the Constitution of Maryland, this Act may not be construed to extend or
23 apply to the salary or compensation of the register of wills in office on the effective
24 date of this Act, but the provisions of this Act concerning the salary or compensation
25 of the register of wills shall take effect at the beginning of the next following term of
26 office.

27 SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
28 October 1, 2002.
