Senate Bill 167 (Senator Hafer, *et al.*) Judicial Proceedings

Vehicle Laws - Motorcycle Helmets - Minors

This bill provides that motorcycle helmet laws apply only to minors.

Fiscal Summary

State Effect: FY 2003 general fund expenditures could increase by \$5,000 for reprinting of a manual and development of a brochure. Potential minimal decrease in general fund revenues due to fewer citations for helmet violations. Enforcement could be handled with existing resources.

Local Effect: Enforcement could be handled with existing resources.

Small Business Effect: None.

Analysis

Current Law: Anyone riding on or operating a motorcycle must wear a helmet.

State Fiscal Effect: The Motor Vehicle Administration advises that the bill would require a one-time expenditure of \$5,000 in fiscal 2003 to update the motorcycle operator's manual and develop a brochure.

Approximately 300 citations are issued statewide each year for failure to wear a helmet while riding on or operating a motorcycle. Presumably, most of these citations are issued to adults, but those numbers are not readily available. The citation carries a fine of \$60. General fund revenues could decrease minimally if fewer citations are issued for violations of helmet laws. As a point of reference, if all of these citations were to result in collection of the \$60 fine, revenues would decrease by \$18,000.

Additional Information

Prior Introductions: In 2001, SB 197 passed out of the Judicial Proceedings Committee, but failed on second reading in the Senate. In 1999, SB 239 also failed on second reading after passing out of Judicial Proceedings.
