5 FOR the purpose of altering the annual license fee for the Prince George's County
6 Class B-Education Conference Facility/Dining Service (ECF/DS) beer, wine and
7 liquor license; and generally relating to the Prince George's County Class
8 B-ECF/DS beer, wine and liquor license.

19 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
20 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

Article 2B - Alcoholic Beverages

3 (r) (1) (i) This subsection applies only in Prince George's County.

4 (12) (i) There is a Class B-ECF/DS license.

5 (ii) The annual license fee is [~~\$4,400~~] \$6,750.6 (iii) The Board may issue a special Class B beer, wine and liquor
7 (on-sale) license known as a Class B-Education Conference Facility/Dining Service
8 license (Class B-ECF/DS license).9 (iv) A Class B-ECF/DS license may only be issued to an individual
10 who is:11 1. Authorized by the University of Maryland, College Park to
12 act on its behalf under this license and be subject to the conditions, restrictions, and
13 penalties under this article; and

14 2. A resident and registered voter of Prince George's County.

15 (v) The residency requirement under § 9-101 of this article does
16 not apply to a license applicant under this paragraph.17 (vi) A Class B-ECF/DS license authorizes the holder to sell beer,
18 wine, and liquor from multiple designated outlets on the University's campus only at
19 University-related functions catered by the Department of Dining Services.20 (vii) 1. A Class B-ECF/DS license is restricted to on-sale
21 privileges only.22 2. Any alcoholic beverages purchased at a designated outlet
23 shall be consumed within the confines of that outlet and may not be transported to
24 another outlet.25 (viii) All profits from the retail sale of alcoholic beverages under this
26 paragraph shall be deposited in the Dining Services Income Fund of the University of
27 Maryland.

28 (ix) The Board:

29 1. May regulate the manner in which alcoholic beverages are
30 dispensed under a Class B-ECF/DS license;31 2. Prior to the issuance of this license, shall designate the
32 exact campus locations for the outlets for the sale of alcoholic beverages under this
33 license;
