CHAPTER 423

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Montgomery County - Oakmont Special Taxing Area - Compensation of**
3 **Citizens' Committee Members**
4 **MC 306-03**

5 FOR the purpose of repealing a certain limitation on the amount of compensation that
6 members of the Oakmont Citizens' Committee may receive; providing that this
7 Act does not apply to the salary or compensation of the incumbent members of
8 the Oakmont Citizens' Committee; and generally relating to the compensation of
9 members of the Oakmont Citizens' Committee.

10 BY repealing and reenacting, with amendments,
11 The Public Local Laws of Montgomery County
12 Section 70-3(c)
13 Article 16 - Public Local Laws of Maryland
14 (1997 Edition and October 2002 Supplement, as amended)

15 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
16 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

17 **Article 16 - Montgomery County**

18 70-3.

19 (c) The members and officers of the Oakmont Citizens' Committee shall be
20 compensated for their services in an amount determined by the committee[, but each
21 not to receive more than five hundred dollars (\$500.00) per year]. Any change in such
22 compensation is not effective until the qualified voters of Oakmont have been given

1 an opportunity to vote thereon and the change has been approved by a majority of the
2 votes cast.

3 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That, pursuant to Article III,
4 Section 35 of the Constitution of Maryland, this Act may not be construed to extend or
5 apply to the salary or compensation of the members of the Oakmont Citizens'
6 Committee in office on the effective date of this Act, but the provisions of this Act
7 concerning the removal of the limitation on the maximum amount of salary or
8 compensation of the members of the Oakmont Citizens' Committee shall take effect at
9 the beginning of the next following term of office.

10 SECTION ~~2~~ 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take
11 effect October 1, 2003.
