12 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
13 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

14 **Article - Health - General**

16 (a) In this section the following words have the meanings indicated.

17 (10) "Specimen" means:

18 (i) Blood derived from the human body;

19 (ii) Urine derived from the human body; [or]

1 (iii) Hair derived from the human body as provided in subsection
2 (b)(2) of this section; OR

3 (IV) SALIVA DERIVED FROM THE HUMAN BODY.

4 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
5 October 1, 2003.
