4 FOR the purpose of expanding the scope of the prohibition against damaging property

2 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF3 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

6 (A) IN THIS SUBTITLE THE FOLLOWING WORDS HAVE THE MEANINGS 7 INDICATED:

8 (B), "SEXUAL ORIENTATION" MEANS THE IDENTIFICATION OF AN INDIVIDUAL 9 AS TO MALE OR FEMALE HOMOSEXUALITY, HETEROSEXUALITY, OR BISEXUALITY.

10 (C) "GENDER IDENTITY OR EXPRESSION" MEANS HAVING OR BEING

11 PERCEIVED AS HAVING A GENDER RELATED IDENTITY, APPEARANCE, EXPRESSION,

12 OR BEHAVIOR, WHETHER OR NOT THAT IDENTITY, APPEARANCE, EXPRESSION, OR

- 13 BEHAVIOR IS DIFFERENT FROM THAT STEREOTYPICALLY ASSOCIATED WITH THE
- 14 PERSON'S ASSIGNED SEX AT BIRTH.

16 A person may not deface, damage, or destroy, or attempt to deface, damage, or 17 destroy, personal or real property that is owned, leased, or used by a religious entity 18 or for any religious purpose including:

19	(1)	[a church, synagogue, or other] ANY A place of worship;

21 (3) a religious school, educational facility, or community center; and

A person may not, by force or threat of force, obstruct or attempt to obstruct another in the free exercise of that person's religious beliefs.

27 Because of another's race, color, religious beliefs, SEXUAL ORIENTATION,

A person may not deface, damage, or destroy, attempt to deface, damage, or 7 destroy, burn or attempt to burn an object on, or damage the real or personal property 8 connected to a building that is publicly or privately owned, leased, or used, including 9 a cemetery, library, meeting hall, recreation center, or school: (1)because a person or group of a particular race, color, religious belief, 11 SEXUAL ORIENTATION, GENDER IDENTITY OR EXPRESSION, or national origin has 12 contacts or is associated with the building; or (2)if there is evidence that exhibits animosity against a person or group, 14 because of the race, color, religious beliefs, SEXUAL ORIENTATION, GENDER IDENTITY 15 OR EXPRESSION, or national origin of that person or group. 16 [10-305.] 10-306. A person who violates this subtitle is subject to the following penalties: (A)if the violation involves a separate crime that is a felony, the person is (1)19 guilty of a felony and on conviction is subject: to imprisonment not exceeding 10 years or a fine not exceeding (i) 21 \$10,000 or both; or if the violation also results in death to a victim, to (ii) 23 imprisonment not exceeding 20 years or a fine not exceeding \$20,000 or both; and in all other cases, the person is guilty of a misdemeanor and on (2)25 conviction is subject to imprisonment not exceeding 3 years or a fine not exceeding 26 \$5,000 or both.

AN ORDER OF PROBATION OR CONDITIONAL RELEASE ENTERED 27 (B) 28 FOLLOWING A CONVICTION FOR A CRIME UNDER §§ 10-302 THROUGH 10-305 OF THIS 29 SUBTITLE SHALL INCLUDE A CONDITION THAT THE OFFENDER PERFORM PUBLIC OR 30 COMMUNITY SERVICE OF NOT LESS THAN 200 HOURS.

32 Prosecution of a person under this subtitle does not preclude prosecution and 33 imposition of penalties for another crime in addition to the penalties imposed under 34 this subtitle.

35 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 36 October 1, 2004.
