CHAPTER 144

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Campaign Finance - Contributions ~~by Credit Card~~ - ~~Limitation~~ Credit Cards**

3 FOR the purpose of altering a certain limitation on the amount of contributions that
4 may be made by credit card to candidates and political committees; and
5 generally relating to campaign contributions ~~by credit card~~.

11 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
12 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

1 **Article - Election Law**

2 13-226.

3 (a) The limits on contributions in this section do not apply to:

4 (1) a contribution to a ballot issue committee; or

5 (2) those contributions defined as transfers.

6 (b) Subject to subsection ~~(d)~~ (C) of this section, a person may not, either
7 directly or indirectly, in an election cycle make:

8 (1) aggregate contributions in excess of:

9 (i) \$4,000 to any one campaign finance entity; or

10 (ii) \$10,000 to all campaign finance entities; or

11 (2) a contribution of money in excess of \$100 except by check OR CREDIT
12 CARD.13 ~~(c) A person may not make a contribution by credit card greater than [\$100]
14 \$1,000 per transaction.~~15 ~~(d)~~ (1) Notwithstanding subsection (b) of this section, a central committee of
16 a political party may make aggregate in-kind contributions during an election cycle
17 that are not in excess of:18 (i) for a State central committee, \$1 for every two registered voters
19 in the State; and20 (ii) for a local central committee, \$1 for every two registered voters
21 in the county.22 (2) For the purposes of paragraph (1) of this subsection, the number of
23 registered voters is determined, regardless of party affiliation, as of the first day of
24 the election cycle.25 ~~(e)~~ (D) The limit on contributions to the campaign finance entity of a
26 candidate applies regardless of the number of offices sought by the candidate or
27 campaign finance entities formed to support the candidate.28 ~~(f)~~ (E) Contributions by a corporation and any wholly-owned subsidiary of
29 the corporation, or by two or more corporations owned by the same stockholders, shall
30 be considered as being made by one contributor.31 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
32 October 1, 2004.
