CHAPTER 17

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Criminal Injuries Compensation Board - Emergency Award**

3 FOR the purpose of increasing the amount payable as an emergency award for
4 criminal injuries compensation; providing a certain exception to the
5 requirement that an emergency award be repaid under certain circumstances;
6 and generally relating to criminal injuries compensation.

12 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
13 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

14 **Article - Criminal Procedure**

15 11-813.

16 (a) The Board may make an emergency award to the claimant before making
17 a final decision in the case, if the Board determines, before taking action on the claim,
18 that:

19 (1) an award likely will be made on the claim; and

1 (2) the claimant will suffer undue hardship unless immediate payment
2 is made.

3 (b) (1) The amount of an emergency award under this section:

4 (i) may not exceed [\$1,000] \$2,000; and

5 (ii) shall be deducted from any final award made to the claimant.

6 (2) [A] EXCEPT AS PROVIDED IN PARAGRAPH (3) OF THIS SUBSECTION,
7 A claimant shall repay the Board:

8 (i) the excess of the amount of the emergency award over any final
9 award; or

10 (ii) if a final award is not made, all of the emergency award.

11 (3) ON WRITTEN REQUEST BY A CLAIMANT, FOR A COMPELLING REASON
12 THE BOARD MAY WAIVE THE REQUIREMENT THAT A CLAIMANT REPAY AN
13 EMERGENCY AWARD UNDER PARAGRAPH (2) OF THIS SUBSECTION.

14 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take
15 effect October 1, 2004.
