CHAPTER 58

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Garrett County - Alcoholic Beverages - Underage Employees**

3 FOR the purpose of clarifying that the restriction on alcoholic beverages licensees in
4 Garrett County on employing underage persons applies only to the handling of
5 alcoholic beverages; repealing a general prohibition against licensees employing
6 underage persons; and generally relating to alcoholic beverages employees in
7 Garrett County.

18 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
19 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

Article 2B - Alcoholic Beverages

2 12-212.

3 [(a)] In Garrett County licensees shall sell beer for cash only and no suit may
4 be maintained by any retail dealer against any person for beer which has been sold on
5 credit. It is unlawful for any licensee to allow any person not designated under §
6 1-102(a)(6) of this article to loaf or loiter about his place of business.

7 [(b) It is unlawful for any liquor licensee under this article to employ any
8 person under the age of 18 years.]

10 (b) In the following jurisdictions the specified exceptions to subsection (a) of
11 this section apply:

12 (8) (i) The provisions of this paragraph apply only in Garrett County.

13 (iv) A licensee may not employ a person under the age of 18 years to
14 handle alcoholic beverages.

15 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take
16 effect October 1, 2004.
