15 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

1 **Article - State Personnel and Pensions** 2 29-115. This section applies only to a disability retiree who is not eligible to 3 (a) (1) 4 receive a normal service retirement. THIS SECTION DOES NOT APPLY TO A DISABILITY RETIREE OF THE 5 (2) 6 STATE POLICE RETIREMENT SYSTEM OR THE LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICERS' 7 PENSION SYSTEM IF THE RETIREE: 8 (I) RETIRED BEFORE JULY 1, 2005; OR 9 (H)1. Upon receiving satisfactory documentation that the retiree is no 28 29 longer employed by a participating employer, the Board of Trustees shall reinstate the 30 retiree's allowance with accumulated cost-of-living adjustments from the date the 31 allowance was temporarily suspended. 32 The retiree's allowance will be reinstated on the first day of the 33 month following the month in which the retiree ceased employment with the 34 participating employer.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 2 July 1, 2005.
