- 12 (g) (1) THE POLICE OFFICERS AND OTHER OFFICERS, AGENTS, AND 13 EMPLOYEES COMING FROM ONE COUNTY OR MUNICIPAL CORPORATION TO 14 ANOTHER WITHIN THE STATE UNDER A RECIPROCAL AGREEMENT UNDER THIS 15 SECTION, MAY ENFORCE THE LAWS OF THE STATE TO THE SAME EXTENT AS 16 AUTHORIZED LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICERS OF THE RECEIVING COUNTY OR 17 MUNICIPAL CORPORATION.
- 18 (2) The police officers and other officers, agents, and employees coming 19 into the State under a reciprocal agreement under this section, may enforce the laws 20 of the State to the same extent as authorized law enforcement officers of a county or 21 municipal corporation in the State.
