A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

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Criminal Procedure - Life Imprisonment - Grant of Parole

3 FOR the purpose of providing that certain inmates serving sentences of imprisonment

4 with the possibility of parole may be paroled if they have earned a certain

5 minimum number of diminution credits and the parole is granted by a majority

- 6 of the Board of Review for the Patuxent Institution or a majority of the
- 7 Maryland Parole Commission; repealing a provision requiring that the approval
- 8 of the Governor be obtained before certain inmates may be paroled; and
- 9 generally relating to parole and inmates who are sentenced to life imprisonment
- 10 with the possibility of parole.

21 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF

22 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

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Article - Correctional Services

(b) "Board of Review" means the institutional Board of Review created under§ 4-205 of this title.

33 If an inmate has been sentenced to imprisonment for life (3)(i) 34 without the possibility of parole under § 2-203 or § 2-304 of the Criminal Law Article, 35 the inmate is not eligible for parole consideration and may not be granted parole at

36 any time during the inmate's sentence.

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1 (ii) This paragraph does not restrict the authority of the Governor 2 to pardon or remit any part of a sentence under § 7-601 of this title.

3 (4) If eligible for parole under this subsection, an inmate serving a term 4 of life imprisonment may only be paroled [with the approval of the Governor] IF:

5 (I) THE INMATE HAS EARNED AT LEAST 1,500 DIMINUTION 6 CREDITS; AND

7 (II) A MAJORITY OF THE COMMISSION GRANTS THE PAROLE.

8 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 9 October 1, 2005.
