3 FOR the purpose of authorizing a railroad police officer who is employed by a certain

- 4 railroad company to exercise the powers of a peace or police officer anywhere in

- 7 requiring a railroad police officer to provide certain notice to certain persons

20 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF

21 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

25 (b) (1) "Railroad company" means a railway company or corporation, 26 together with its subsidiaries, corporate affiliates, and parent companies, that is

engaged as a common carrier in the furnishing or sale of transportation subject to
 Subtitle IV of Title 49 of the United States Code.

3 (2) "Railroad company" includes a corporation the title of which contains 4 a combination of words similar to "railway company".

5 (c) "Railroad police officer" means an individual appointed by the Governor to 6 act as a police officer for a railroad company under this subtitle.

9 (a) Each railroad police officer has all the powers granted to a peace or police 10 officer.

(b) [A] EXCEPT AS PROVIDED IN SUBSECTION (C) OF THIS SECTION, A
railroad police officer may exercise the powers granted under this subtitle only if the
railroad police officer:

14 (1) is on real or personal property owned, leased, operated, or controlled 15 by the railroad company that employs the railroad police officer;

16 (2) is in fresh pursuit of a suspect;

 DESIGNEE, WHEN ON PROPERTY OWNED, LEASED, OPERATED BY, OR UNDER THE
 CONTROL OF THE MARYLAND TRANSPORTATION AUTHORITY, MARYLAND AVIATION
 ADMINISTRATION, OR MARYLAND PORT ADMINISTRATION; AND

14 (II) THE DEPARTMENT OF STATE POLICE BARRACK COMMANDER
15 OR COMMANDER'S DESIGNEE, UNLESS THERE IS AN AGREEMENT OTHERWISE WITH
16 THE DEPARTMENT OF STATE POLICE.

(2) WHEN THE RAILROAD POLICE OFFICER PARTICIPATES IN A JOINT
 INVESTIGATION WITH OFFICIALS FROM ANOTHER STATE, FEDERAL, OR LOCAL LAW
 ENFORCEMENT UNIT, THE RAILROAD POLICE OFFICER SHALL COMPLY WITH THE
 NOTICE REQUIREMENT OF PARAGRAPH (1) OF THIS SUBSECTION.

21 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 22 October 1, 2005.
