1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Public Records - Prohibition on Inspection of Retirement Records -**
3 **Exceptions**

4 FOR the purpose of requiring a custodian of a public record to allow inspection of a
5 retirement record when the record is requested by a party or by the attorney
6 representing a party in a divorce, alimony, custody, or child support case; and
7 generally relating to the inspection of retirement records.

18 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
19 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

20 **Article - State Government**

21 10-616.

22 (g) (1) Subject to paragraphs (2) through (7) of this subsection, a custodian
23 shall deny inspection of a retirement record for an individual.

24 (2) A custodian shall permit inspection:

25 (i) by the person in interest;

26 (ii) by the appointing authority of the individual;

1 (iii) after the death of the individual, by a beneficiary, personal
2 representative, or other person who satisfies the administrators of the retirement and
3 pension systems that the person has a valid claim to the benefits of the individual;
4 [and]

5 (iv) by any law enforcement agency in order to obtain the home
6 address of a retired employee of the agency when contact with a retired employee is
7 documented to be necessary for official agency business; AND

8 (V) BY A PARTY OR BY THE ATTORNEY REPRESENTING A PARTY IN
9 A DIVORCE, ALIMONY, CUSTODY, OR CHILD SUPPORT CASE.

10 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
11 October 1, 2005.
