(c) (d) The Task Force shall: 6 7 examine the billing practices of gas, electric, cable television, (1) 8 telephone, and wireless telephone companies in the State, including how rates are calculated and how different charges are presented on the bills; 10 examine the regulatory authority of the federal, State, and local 11 governments over the billing practices of gas, electric, cable television, telephone, and 12 wireless telephone companies in the State; and 13 recommend any changes that State and local governments should (3) 14 pursue to make the bills of gas, electric, cable television, telephone, and wireless 15 telephone companies easier for the citizens of the State to understand. 16 A member of the Task Force: (e) 17 (1) may not receive compensation; but 18 (2) is entitled to reimbursement for expenses under the Standard State 19 Travel Regulations, as provided in the State budget. 20 (f) The Office of People's Counsel shall provide staff support for the Task 21 Force. 22 The Task Force shall issue a final report of its findings and 23 recommendations to the Governor and, subject to § 2-1246 of the State Government Article, to the General Assembly on or before December 31, 2005.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect

26 June 1, 2005. It shall remain effective for a period of 7 months and, at the end of 27 December 31, 2005, with no further action required by the General Assembly, this Act

28 shall be abrogated and of no further force and effect.
