A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 Correctional Officers' Retirement System - Membership - Division of Parole 3 and Probation 4 FOR the purpose of altering a certain fee for certain individuals placed under the 5 supervision of the Division of Parole and Probation; requiring that a certain amount of a certain fee be used to fund certain retirement benefit enhancements 6 7 for certain members of the Division of Parole and Probation of the Department 8 of Public Safety and Correctional Services as provided for in this Act; providing 9 agents who are employed by the Division of Parole and Probation of the Department of Public Safety and Correctional Services with membership in the 10 Correctional Officers' Retirement System; requiring the Board of Trustees of the 11 State Retirement and Pension System to transfer certain contributions to 12 certain funds of the Correctional Officers' Retirement System; requiring agents 13 14 who are employed by the Division of Parole and Probation of the Department of Public Safety and Correctional Services to have a certain number of years of 15 eligibility service or be a certain age to receive a normal service retirement 16 allowance from the Correctional Officers' Retirement System; providing certain 17 18 retirees of the Correctional Officers' Retirement System who were agents 19 employed by the Division of Parole and Probation of the Department of Public 20 Safety and Correctional Services with a certain cost-of-living adjustment; 21 providing that certain provisions of law do not apply to certain transfers between the employees' systems and the Correctional Officers' Retirement 22 23 System; and generally relating to transferring agents who are employed by the Division of Parole and Probation of the Department of Public Safety and 24 Correctional Services into the Correctional Officers' Retirement System. 25 26 BY repealing and reenacting, without amendments, 27 Article - Criminal Procedure 28 Section 6-226(a) 29 Annotated Code of Maryland

14 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF

15 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

Article - Criminal Procedure

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18 (a) In this section, "supervisee" means a person that the court places under19 the supervision of the Division of Parole and Probation.

20 (b) Unless the supervisee is exempt under subsection (d) of this section, the 21 court shall impose a monthly fee of [\$25] \$40 on a supervisee.

3 (a) Subject to subsection (b) of this section, this title applies to transfers from 4 a State or local retirement or pension system to another State or local retirement or 5 pension system only if:

6 (1) each system is operated on an actuarial basis; and

7 (2) under each system contributions that are computed to be sufficient to 8 provide the reserves needed to cover the benefits payable on account of the system's 9 members are made during the employment of members.

10 (b) This title does not apply to:

11 (1) a transfer to the Judges' Retirement System of the State of Maryland;

SAFETY AND CORRECTIONAL SERVICES; OR

(9) A TRANSFER BETWEEN THE EMPLOYEES' PENSION SYSTEM AND THE
 2 CORRECTIONAL OFFICERS' RETIREMENT SYSTEM IF THE MEMBER IS AN AGENT OF
 3 THE DIVISION OF PAROLE AND PROBATION OF THE DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC SAFETY
