- 17 (a) A minor who is 16 years old or older has the same capacity as an
- 18 adult to consent to consultation, diagnosis, and treatment of a mental or emotional
- 19 disorder by a physician, psychologist, or a clinic.
- 20 (2) The capacity of a minor to consent to consultation, diagnosis, and
- 21 treatment of a mental or emotional disorder by a physician, psychologist, or a clinic
- 22 under paragraph (1) of this subsection does not include the capacity to refuse
- 23 consultation, diagnosis, or treatment for a mental or emotional disorder for which a
- 24 parent, guardian, or custodian of the minor has given consent.
