- 16 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
- 17 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

- 20 (A) WITH RESPECT TO ANY ELEMENTARY SCHOOL THAT HAS FAILED TO MEET
- 21 THE EDUCATION ACCOUNTABILITY STANDARDS ESTABLISHED UNDER § 7-203 OF
- 22 THIS ARTICLE, THE COUNTY BOARD THAT HAS JURISDICTION OVER THAT SCHOOL
- 23 SHALL PROVIDE FOR THE USE OF INSTRUCTIONAL ASSISTANTS IN ALL CLASSES AND
- 24 FOR ALL SCHOOL ACTIVITIES IN KINDERGARTEN THROUGH GRADE THREE THAT
- 25 HAVE MORE THAN 15 STUDENTS ENROLLED IN THE CLASS OR THE ACTIVITY.
- 26 (B) (1) AN INSTRUCTIONAL ASSISTANT SHALL ASSIST A CERTIFICATED

  4 (C) AN INSTRUCTIONAL ASSISTANT SHALL BE A HIGH SCHOOL GRADUATE OR
  5 HOLD A GENERAL EQUIVALENCY DIPLOMA.
  6 (D) AN INSTRUCTIONAL ASSISTANT MAY NOT WORK IN A CLASS IF THE
  7 INSTRUCTIONAL ASSISTANT IS A PARENT OR GUARDIAN OF A STUDENT IN THE

- 9 (E) THE COUNTY SUPERINTENDENT SHALL ADOPT GUIDELINES FOR THE USE 10 OF INSTRUCTIONAL ASSISTANTS IN THE COUNTY.
- 11 (F) (1) (I) A COUNTY GOVERNING BODY SHALL APPROPRIATE LOCAL 12 FUNDS IN AN AMOUNT NECESSARY TO FUND 80 PERCENT OF THE COSTS OF 13 IMPLEMENTING THIS SECTION.

- 17 (2) (I) THE GOVERNOR SHALL INCLUDE FUNDS IN THE STATE 18 BUDGET IN AN AMOUNT NECESSARY TO FUND 20 PERCENT OF THE COSTS OF 19 IMPLEMENTING THIS SECTION.
- 20 (II) STATE APPROPRIATIONS MADE TO IMPLEMENT THIS SECTION
  21 MAY NOT BE USED TO SUPPLANT THE EXISTING STATE SHARE OF BASIC CURRENT
  22 EXPENSES UNDER § 5-202 OF THIS ARTICLE.
- 23 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 24 July 1, 2005.
