16 17	SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

20 21	(a) Notwithstanding any other provision of this title, a person may not ride a bicycle or a motor scooter:
22 23	(1) On any roadway where the posted maximum speed limit is more than 50 miles an hour; or
	(2) On any expressway, except on an adjacent bicycle path or way approved by the State Highway Administration, or on any other controlled access highway signed in accordance with § 21-313 of this title.
27 28	(b) [(1) Where there is a bike lane paved to a smooth surface or a shoulder paved to a smooth surface, a person operating a bicycle or a motor scooter shall use
