1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Law Enforcement Officers' Pension System - Transfers of Members of the**
 3 **Maryland Transit Administration Police Force**

4 FOR the purpose of transferring certain members of the Maryland Transit
 5 Administration Police Force from the Maryland Transit Administration Pension
 6 System to the Law Enforcement Officers' Pension System; requiring the
 7 Maryland Transit Administration to pay to the Board of Trustees for the State
 8 Retirement and Pension System certain employer contributions and to transfer
 9 certain employer contributions to the Board of Trustees; requiring the Board of
 10 Trustees to ~~transfer~~ deposit certain funds to the Law Enforcement Officers'
 11 Pension System Accumulation Fund; providing for certain members of the ~~Mass~~
 12 Maryland Transit Administration Police Force to transfer service credit into the
 13 Law Enforcement Officers' Pension System; providing that certain members of
 14 the ~~Mass~~ Maryland Transit Administration Police Force shall ~~deposit~~ make a
 15 certain election regarding payment of certain contributions at a certain rate for
 16 a certain period of time into the annuity savings fund for the Law Enforcement
 17 Officers' Pension System in a certain manner; requiring the Maryland Transit
 18 Administration to perform certain calculations and compile certain information
 19 for the Board of Trustees of the State Retirement and Pension System;
 20 specifying certain methods for calculating and paying certain member
 21 contributions; requiring the Maryland Transit Administration to make certain
 22 payments to the Board of Trustees of the State Retirement and Pension System
 23 under certain circumstances; requiring that the retirement allowance of certain
 24 members of the Maryland Transit Administration be reduced by a certain
 25 amount; reducing a retirement allowance for certain members of the ~~Mass~~
 26 Maryland Transit Administration Police Force who transfer into the Law
 27 Enforcement Officers' Pension System and do not make certain contributions;

1 excluding certain members from having to participate in the ~~Mass~~ Maryland
2 Transit Administration Police Force; providing that certain transfers of
3 members from the Maryland Transit Administration Pension System to the Law
4 Enforcement Officers' Pension System is the result of a collectively bargained
5 agreement; requiring the Maryland Transit Administration to provide certain
6 assistance to the Board of Trustees for the State Retirement and Pension
7 System; and generally relating to the transfer of certain members of the
8 Maryland Transit Administration Police Force from the Maryland Transit
9 Administration Pension System to the Law Enforcement Officers' Pension
10 System.

 38 Employees' Retirement System, the Board of Trustees shall transfer to the

1 accumulation fund of the Law Enforcement Officers' Pension System the employer
 2 contributions that were made to the Employees' Retirement System and the
 3 Employees' Pension System on behalf of those members who transferred, plus the
 4 interest earned on those contributions through the date of transfer.

5 (b) For those full-time employees of the BWI Airport Fire & Rescue
 6 Department who were employed on or after October 1, 1993 and who elect
 7 membership in the Law Enforcement Officers' Pension System on or before December
 8 31, 2000, the Board of Trustees shall transfer to the accumulation fund of the Law
