A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Maryland Consolidated Capital Bond Loan of 2003 - Baltimore City -**
3 **Baltimore Center for Children**

4 FOR the purpose of amending Chapter 290 of the Acts of 2002, as amended by
5 Chapter 204 of the Acts of 2003, to change the location of the Baltimore Center
6 for Children to Baltimore City; removing the requirement that the proceeds are
7 to be used for providing handicapped access, a sprinkler system, elevators, an
8 HVAC system, and interior walls to provide separate rooms; making this Act an
9 emergency measure; and generally relating to the financing of certain capital
10 projects.

11 BY repealing and reenacting, with amendments,
12 Chapter 290 of the Acts of the General Assembly of 2002, as amended by
13 Chapter 204 of the Acts of the General Assembly of 2003
14 Section 12(3)(G)

15 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
16 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

17 **Chapter 290 of the Acts of 2002, as amended by Chapter 204 of the Acts of**
18 **2003**

19 SECTION 12. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That:

20 (3) (G) Baltimore Center for Children. Provide a grant equal to
21 the lesser of (i) \$400,000 or (ii) the amount of the matching fund
22 provided, to the Board of Directors of the Baltimore Child Abuse
23 Center, Inc. for the construction, renovation, and capital
24 equipping of the new Baltimore Center for Children building [to
25 include handicapped access, a sprinkler system, elevators, an
26 HVAC system, and interior walls to provide separate rooms,]
27 located [at 2315 St. Paul Street] in Baltimore CITY, subject to
28 the requirement that the grantee grant and convey an historic
29 easement to the Maryland Historical Trust. Notwithstanding
30 the provisions of Section 12(5) of this Act, the matching fund
31 may include real property or funds expended prior to the

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1 effective date of this Act (Baltimore City).....400,000
 2 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act is an
 3 emergency measure, is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public health
 4 or safety, has been passed by a ye and nay vote supported by three-fifths of all the
 5 members elected to each of the two Houses of the General Assembly, and shall take
 6 effect from the date it is enacted.
