## 9. Description and Purpose of Grantee Organization

The Montgomery County Community Foundation is a regional affiliate of The Community Foundation for the National Capital Region, a 501 (c) 3 public foundation. MCCF is serving as the legal fiscal sponsor for the C&O Canal Fund of Montgomery County/Canal Boat Fund, which was set up to receive charitable contributions for the purchase/building of a new Canal Boat on the C&O Canal by the Historic Great Falls Tavern. This fund was established at the request of the Board of Directors of the Friends of the Historic Great Falls Tavern. The first gifts to establish this fund were received from the children and families of the Seven Locks Elementary School who raised \$3160 from an energetic community event organized by third graders. When the full \$600,000 has been raised, the C&O Canal Fund of Montgomery County/Canal Boat Fund will make a grant to the Friends of the Historic Great Falls Tavern to contract with the boat builder. MCCF has a 20 member board of directors and MCCF's chairman sits on the board of the parent foundation, The Community Foundation for the National Capital Region. An annual report and audit are available by request.

The Friends of Historic Great Falls Tavern ("The Friends") is a 501 (c) (3) non-profit organization whose purpose is to provide financial and volunteer support to the National Park Service in the Great Falls Tavern area of the Chesapeake and Ohio Canal National Historical Park. The Friends is an organization of 150 members with a Board of Trustees of 15 members that includes the president, vice-president, secretary, and treasurer. The Friends has raised private funds to purchase forty custom made mahogany shutters for the tavern building, a white picket fence enclosing the tavern yard, period lights outside the tavern building, California cedar flooring for the tavern porch, and wooden benches for the now condemned canal boat, the Canal Clipper. The Friends turned to the Montgomery County Community Foundation to house a C&O Canal Fund/Tavern Endowment which is a permanent endowment established for the Tavern building and programs. Friends launched this effort with a \$25,000 matching grant. To date, Friends have raised \$17,700 toward that match and hope to receive long-term bequest gifts as well.. The Friends is assuming the lead role as the fundraiser for the new Canal Boat, with the C&O Canal Fund/Boat Fund as the fiscal sponsor.

## **10. Description and Purpose of Project**

To raise approximately \$600,000 through public and private donations to purchase a new canal boat for use by the National Park Sevice at the Great Falls Tavern in the C&O Canal National Historical Park located in the state of Maryland. The new canal boat will be a replica of a packet (passenger) boat that was used on the canal when it was a going commercial enterprise. The replica boat will be 90 feet in length, have a beam of 14 feet, an estimated draft of 8 feet, and a depth of 4-6 feet. It will have either a steel or aluminum hull. The upper part of the boat will be wood as were the original packett boats. The boat will be used by the NPS to provide rides on the canal to demonstrate a canal boat going through a working canal lock in front of Great Falls Tavern and being pulled by mules for approximately about a two mile round trip on the canal. The cement/iron supported hull of the old canal boat at the Great Falls Tavern cracked in early 2003 and had begun to desinegrate to the point where two consultant marine engineers declared the hull beyond repair and unsafe for use in the waters of the canal. The boat, when it was usable, carried anually over 18,000 park visitors of which more than 8,000 were school age children who came with school groups or with their family or friends. School children from Washington, Frederick, Montgomery, Prince Georges, Howard, Anne Arundel, and Baltimore counties would come to ride the boat and learn how a lock works and how a family lived their life on a canal boat during the 19th and early 20th century when the canal was being used to transport cargo between Cumberland and Georgetown. School groups from Washington, DC and Northern Virginia would also come to Great Falls Tavern to ride the boat and learn about the canal.
