6. Purpose of Bill

Authorizing the creation of a State debt, the proceeds to serve as a grant to the Board of Directors of Sotterly Foundation, Inc. for the planning, design, acquisition, construction, installation, and capital equipping of security upgrades for Sotterly Plantation, located in Hollywood.

7. Matching Fund Requirements

Prior to the payment of any funds, the grantee shall provide and expend a matching fund. No part of the fund may consist of real property or funds expended prior to the effective date of this Act. The fund may consist of in kind contributions.

8. Special Provisions

Prior to the issuance of the bonds, the grantee shall grant and convey to the Maryland Historical Trust a perpetual preservation easement to the extent of its interest.

9. Description and Purpose of Grantee Organization

The Sotterley Foundation a non-profit organization and is the steward of the Sotterley Plantation. The organization's mission is to preserve, research and interpret Sotterley Plantation's diverse cultures and environments and to serve as a public educational resource.

10. Description and Purpose of Project

Due to increasing incidents of vandalism and after hour trespassing the need has become to great to install fencing and security systems to protect this 300 year old gem of Maryland. Sotterley is representative of the history of our nation, Maryland and St. Mary's County and is used regularly by students of many of Maryland's public and private school systems, along with visitors from around the region. 4,600 feet of fencing will be installed, along with six gates, a security system and security lighting in key locations of the nearly 100 acre site.
