To restore, repair, and renovate Clifton Mansion. As a c.1852 example of Italianate architectural style and the former summer residence of Johns Hopkins, Clifton Mansion is a treasured Baltimore City Landmark in great need of additional repair. The focus of this project is to complete the restoration of the main floor level plus the Grand Staircase and all four levels and exterior of the adjoining tower. Work shall include replacing the roof, uncovering all remaining historic clues and returning the areas of focus as closely as possible to how they looked in 1852. In addition, the project includes providing access for the disabled, installation of new heating and cooling systems for the restored areas and the third floor, and renovating the second floor bathroom.							
Renovation of Clifton Mansion will result in more office/classroom space for Civic Works and free meeting space for community groups. We will also use space in the renovated tower for exhibits of
