1 AN ACT concerning

Public Health - Lyme Disease - Public Awareness Campaign

- FOR the purpose of requiring the Secretary of Health and Mental Hygiene, in collaboration with other State agencies, to establish and promote a certain public awareness campaign related to the prevention of Lyme disease and other tick-borne illnesses; providing for the components of the campaign; authorizing the Secretary to use certain resources to carry out the provisions of this Act; providing for the termination of this Act; and generally relating to a public awareness campaign for Lyme disease.
