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Higher Education – Blind and Print Disabled Students – Instructional Materials

FOR the purpose of requiring the Maryland Library for the Blind and Physically Handicapped to convene a certain committee on or before a certain date; providing for the membership of the committee; requiring a certain number of the members of the committee to be blind or print disabled; requiring the committee to establish certain procedures to facilitate the delivery of certain materials to certain students in certain formats; authorizing the Library to determine certain eligibility of certain students to make certain requests; requiring the Library to make certain requests to certain publishers regarding the provision of certain instructional materials; providing certain publishers a certain period of time to respond to certain requests; requiring certain publishers to indicate certain information to the Library; exempting certain publishers from certain requirements of this Act; requiring the Governor to include in the annual budget submission a certain appropriation beginning in a

12 13	SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

25 26 27 28 29	(A) ON OR BEFORE DECEMBER 1, 2007, IN ORDER TO COORDINATE THE DISTRIBUTION OF INSTRUCTIONAL MATERIALS TO BLIND AND OTHER PRINT DISABLED STUDENTS, THE MARYLAND LIBRARY FOR THE BLIND AND PHYSICALLY HANDICAPPED SHALL CONVENE AN INSTRUCTIONAL MATERIALS ACCESS STANDARDS COMMITTEE.

- 1 (A) THE LIBRARY MAY DETERMINE THE ELIGIBILITY OF A BLIND OR 2 PRINT DISABLED STUDENT WHO MAKES A REQUEST UNDER SUBSECTION (B) OF 3 THIS SECTION.
- (B) ON THE REQUEST OF AN ELIGIBLE BLIND OR PRINT DISABLED STUDENT, THE LIBRARY SHALL REQUEST THAT A PUBLISHER THAT OFFERS FOR SALE ELECTRONIC OR PRINT INSTRUCTIONAL MATERIALS USED BY STUDENTS ENROLLED IN INSTITUTIONS OF HIGHER EDUCATION AND INSTITUTIONS OF POSTSECONDARY EDUCATION IN THE STATE PROVIDE THE INSTRUCTIONAL MATERIALS TO THE LIBRARY ELECTRONICALLY IN A FORMAT DESIGNATED BY THE COMMITTEE.
- 11 (C) ON THE RECEIPT OF A REQUEST UNDER SUBSECTION (B) OF THIS
 12 SECTION, A PUBLISHER SHALL HAVE 10 BUSINESS DAYS FROM THE DATE OF THE
 13 REQUEST TO:
- 14 (1) PROVIDE THE REQUESTED INSTRUCTIONAL MATERIALS IN 15 THE ELECTRONIC FORMAT DESIGNATED BY THE COMMITTEE; OR
- 16 **(2)** PROVIDE THE REASON THAT THE ELECTRONIC FORMAT DESIGNATED BY THE COMMITTEE CANNOT BE PROVIDED WITHIN 10 BUSINESS DAYS.
