A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Education – Creation of the Maryland Education Fund**

3 FOR the purpose of establishing the Maryland Education Fund; establishing the
4 purpose and contents of the Fund; requiring the State Treasurer to hold the
5 Fund separately and invest the money of the Fund in a certain manner;
6 requiring the Comptroller to account for the Fund; requiring the State
7 Superintendent of Schools to adopt certain regulations; providing that after a
8 certain time, the balance remaining on a gift certificate shall be presumed
9 abandoned; requiring a person that sells or issues a gift certificate in the State
10 to remit to the Comptroller the remaining balance on certain gift certificates on
11 or before a certain date each year; requiring the Comptroller to distribute
12 certain revenues to the Maryland Education Fund on or before a certain date
13 each year; altering the information that must be printed on a gift certificate;
14 requiring a certain person to maintain accounts, books, and records relating to
15 the sale and issuance of certain gift certificates for a certain period of time;
16 requiring the person to make the accounts, books, and records available for
17 inspection by the Comptroller; defining a certain term; and generally relating to
18 abandoned gift certificates and the Maryland Education Fund.

9 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
10 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

11 **Article – Commercial Law**

12 14–1319.

13 (a) (1) In this section, “gift certificate” means a device constructed of
14 paper, plastic, or any other material that is:

15 (i) Sold or issued by a person for a cash value that can be used
16 to purchase goods or services; or

17 (ii) Issued as a store credit for returned goods.

18 (2) “Gift certificate” does not include:

19 (i) A prepaid telephone calling card;

20 (ii) A prepaid technical support card;

21 (iii) A prepaid card for Internet services;

22 (iv) A coupon for discounted goods or services;

23 (v) A gift certificate that is distributed to an individual under
24 an awards, loyalty, or promotional program in which the recipient does not give money
25 or value for the gift certificate; [or]

26 (vi) A gift card that:

27 1. Is processed through a national credit or debit card
28 service; and

1 2. May be used to purchase goods or services from
2 multiple unaffiliated sellers of goods or services;

3 **(VII) A GIFT CERTIFICATE THAT IS SOLD BY A CHARITABLE**
4 **OR NONPROFIT ORGANIZATION;**

5 **(VIII) A CARD ISSUED BY AN EMPLOYER TO AN EMPLOYEE AS**
6 **PROOF OF WAGES PAID TO THE EMPLOYEE; OR**

7 **(IX) A CARD ISSUED BY A PUBLIC TRANSIT FACILITY FOR**
8 **THE PAYMENT OF ANY TRANSIT FARES, PARKING FEES, OR TRANSIT-RELATED**
9 **EXPENSES.**

10 (b) A person may not sell or issue a gift certificate that, within 4 years after
11 the date of purchase, is subject to expiration or a fee or charge of any kind.

12 **(c) (1) SUBJECT TO SUBSECTION (F) OF THIS SECTION, IF A GIFT**
13 **CERTIFICATE HAS BEEN INACTIVE FOR A PERIOD OF 4 YEARS FROM THE DATE**
14 **OF PURCHASE, THE BALANCE REMAINING ON THE GIFT CERTIFICATE SHALL BE**
15 **PRESUMED TO BE ABANDONED.**

16 **(2) ON OR BEFORE MARCH 1 OF EACH YEAR, A PERSON THAT**
17 **SELLS OR ISSUES A GIFT CERTIFICATE IN THE STATE SHALL REMIT TO THE**
18 **COMPTROLLER THE BALANCE REMAINING ON EACH GIFT CERTIFICATE THAT**
19 **WAS PRESUMED ABANDONED DURING THE PREVIOUS YEAR.**

20 **(3) ON OR BEFORE APRIL 1 OF EACH YEAR, THE COMPTROLLER**
21 **SHALL DISTRIBUTE THE REVENUES RECEIVED UNDER PARAGRAPH (2) OF THIS**
22 **SUBSECTION TO THE MARYLAND EDUCATION FUND ESTABLISHED UNDER §**
23 **5-201.1 OF THE EDUCATION ARTICLE.**

24 **[(c)] (D)** Any term or condition concerning expiration or a fee or charge that
25 takes effect more than 4 years after the date of purchase, **AND NOTICE OF THE**
26 **PRESUMPTION OF ABANDONMENT UNDER SUBSECTION (C) OF THIS SECTION,**
27 must be printed clearly in at least 10 point type in a visible place on:

28 (1) The front or back of the gift certificate;

29 (2) A sticker permanently affixed to the gift certificate; or

1 (3) An envelope containing the gift certificate.

2 [(d)] (E) Unless the change benefits the consumer, a term or condition
3 disclosed under subsection [(c)] (D) of this section may not be changed after the date of
4 purchase or issuance.

5 [(e)] (F) A gift certificate that is sold or issued in violation of this section
6 shall be considered valid and may not be subject to expiration or any fee or charge.

7 (G) (1) **A PERSON THAT SELLS OR ISSUES A GIFT CERTIFICATE IN THE**
8 **STATE SHALL MAINTAIN ACCOUNTS, BOOKS, AND RECORDS RELATING TO THE**
9 **SALE OR ISSUANCE OF THE GIFT CERTIFICATE FOR AT LEAST 2 YEARS AFTER**
10 **THE DATE THE BALANCE ON THE GIFT CERTIFICATE IS PRESUMED TO BE**
11 **ABANDONED.**

12 (2) **ON REQUEST, THE PERSON SHALL MAKE AVAILABLE ALL OF**
13 **THE ACCOUNTS, BOOKS, AND RECORDS RELATING TO THE SALE OR ISSUANCE OF**
14 **GIFT CERTIFICATES FOR INSPECTION BY THE COMPTROLLER.**

15 [(f)] (H) A violation of any provision of this section:

16 (1) Is an unfair or deceptive trade practice within the meaning of Title
17 13 of this article; and

18 (2) Is subject to the enforcement and penalty provisions contained in
19 Title 13 of this article, except § 13-411 of this article.

21 **5-201.1.**

22 (A) **IN THIS SECTION, "FUND" MEANS THE MARYLAND EDUCATION**
23 **FUND.**

24 (B) **THERE IS A MARYLAND EDUCATION FUND.**

25 (C) **THE PURPOSE OF THE FUND IS TO HELP FINANCE PUBLIC SCHOOL**
26 **EDUCATION.**

27 (D) **THE STATE SUPERINTENDENT SHALL ADMINISTER THE FUND.**

1 **(E) (1) THE FUND IS A SPECIAL, NONLAPSING FUND THAT IS NOT**
2 **SUBJECT TO § 7-302 OF THE STATE FINANCE AND PROCUREMENT ARTICLE.**

3 **(2) THE STATE TREASURER SHALL HOLD THE FUND**
4 **SEPARATELY, AND THE COMPTROLLER SHALL ACCOUNT FOR THE FUND.**

5 **(F) THE FUND CONSISTS OF:**

6 **(1) REVENUE DISTRIBUTED TO THE FUND FROM ABANDONED**
7 **GIFT CERTIFICATES UNDER § 14-1319 OF THE COMMERCIAL LAW ARTICLE;**

8 **(2) INVESTMENT EARNINGS; AND**

9 **(3) ANY OTHER MONEY FROM ANY OTHER SOURCE ACCEPTED**
10 **FOR THE BENEFIT OF THE FUND.**

11 **(G) THE FUND MAY ONLY BE USED TO HELP FINANCE PUBLIC SCHOOL**
12 **EDUCATION.**

13 **(H) THE STATE SUPERINTENDENT SHALL ADOPT REGULATIONS TO**
14 **CARRY OUT THE PURPOSE OF THE FUND.**

15 **(I) (1) THE STATE TREASURER SHALL INVEST THE MONEY OF THE**
16 **FUND IN THE SAME MANNER AS OTHER STATE MONEY MAY BE INVESTED.**

17 **(2) ANY INVESTMENT EARNINGS OF THE FUND SHALL BE**
18 **CREDITED TO THE FUND.**

19 **(J) EXPENDITURES FROM THE FUND MAY BE MADE ONLY IN**
20 **ACCORDANCE WITH THE STATE BUDGET.**

21 **(K) MONEY EXPENDED FROM THE FUND FOR PUBLIC EDUCATION IS**
22 **SUPPLEMENTAL TO AND IS NOT INTENDED TO TAKE THE PLACE OF FUNDING**
23 **THAT OTHERWISE WOULD BE APPROPRIATED FOR PUBLIC EDUCATION.**

24 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
25 October 1, 2007.
