HOUSE BILL 1109

1 (1) An action in contract or tort, if the debt or damages claimed do not 2 exceed [\$25,000] **\$30,000**, exclusive of prejudgment or postjudgment interest, costs, 3 and attorney's fees if attorney's fees are recoverable by law or contract;

4 (3) A matter of attachment before judgment, if the sum claimed does 5 not exceed [\$25,000] **\$30,000**, exclusive of prejudgment or postjudgment interest, 6 costs, and attorney's fees if attorney's fees are recoverable by law or contract;

7 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall be 8 construed to apply only prospectively and may not be applied or interpreted to have 9 any effect on or application to any case filed before the effective date of this Act.

SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
 October 1, 2007.
