Department of Health and Mental Hygiene - Regulation of Nursing Homes -Review

This bill requires the Department of Health and Mental Hygiene (DHMH), in consultation with other specified parties, to review current State laws and regulations, best practices, and experiences of other states with regard to the regulation of nursing homes in the State. DHMH must report by January 1, 2008 on the review, including a discussion of: • the status of and demand for electronic monitoring; • resident-directed care and whether specific State regulations may be barriers to culture change and patients' rights; • the status and rights of family councils; • communication between residents or their legal representatives and nursing homes; • whether specific State regulations should be changed to provide nursing homes with greater flexibility while maintaining safety; and • any other issue that DHMH considers necessary to review.

The bill takes effect June 1, 2007.

Analysis

Background: There are approximately 238 licensed nursing homes in Maryland. According to the Office of Health Care Quality, State nursing home regulations have not been comprehensively reviewed in many years.
