CHAPTER		
AN ACT concerning		
Juvenile Justice Monitoring Unit – Expansion of Jurisdiction		
FOR the purpose of expanding the jurisdiction of the Juvenile Justice Monitoring Unit of the Office of the Attorney General to include the monitoring of any <u>residential</u> facility licensed by the Department of Juvenile Services; <u>expanding the duties of the Juvenile Justice Monitoring Unit; requiring the Juvenile Justice Monitoring Unit to make certain reports to the Executive Director of the Governor's Office for <u>Children; defining a certain term; repealing a certain definition;</u> altering a certain definition; making certain stylistic changes; authorizing the Governor to transfer certain positions and funds in a certain manner; <u>authorizing the Attorney General to transfer a certain position in a certain manner; making making</u></u>

transfer two regular positions and \$120,000 for those positions from the Department of
Juvenile Services to the Juvenile Justice Monitoring Unit of the Office of the Attorney
General. The Attorney General may transfer one regular position to the Juvenile
Justice Monitoring Unit of the Office of the Attorney General.
