Crimes – Hate Crimes – Hanging or Placing of a Noose <u>Use of a Noose or</u> Swastika to Threaten or Intimidate

- 4 FOR the purpose of expanding the scope of the prohibition against defacement of certain property and damage to certain buildings to include the hanging or 5 placing of a noose on the real or personal property of a person or group or on the 6 7 real or personal property connected to a certain building because of the race, 8 color, religious beliefs, sexual orientation, or national origin of a certain person 9 or group prohibiting a person from affixing, erecting, or placing a noose or swastika on a certain building or real property, without the express permission 10 of the owner of the building or property or the owner's agent, with the intent to 11 threaten or intimidate any person or group of persons; establishing that a 12 certain penalty applies to a violation of this Act; and generally relating to hate 13 erimes the use of a noose or swastika to threaten or intimidate a person or 14 group of persons. 15
