## **Higher Education - Maryland Truth in Tuition Act**

3 FOR the purpose of requiring a governing board to develop, on or before a certain date, 4 a long-term tuition plan for certain public senior higher education institutions; 5 providing that the purpose of the long-term tuition plan is to ensure that certain students enrolling in and certain individuals who apply for admission to 6 certain public senior higher education institutions are informed of the tuition 7 8 that will be charged for a certain number of academic years of enrollment; 9 requiring a governing board or public senior higher education institution to 10 publish certain tuition rates in certain materials; requiring tuition rates for certain years to be included in certain published materials; authorizing the 11 12 inclusion of certain tuition increases in certain long-term tuition plans under 13 certain circumstances; requiring a governing board to update a long-term tuition plan on or before a certain date each year; prohibiting a governing board 14 15 from changing tuition rates developed previously under a certain long-term tuition plan; defining certain terms; and generally relating to the development 16 17 of a long-term tuition plan for certain public senior higher education 18 institutions and the publication of certain tuition rates.
