- 19 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF

1 **Article - State Government** 2 2-10A-06. In this section, "conditions of well-being" means the desired results 3 (a) identified by the Maryland Partnership for Children, Youth, and Families based upon 4 5 identified needs and used to improve quality. 6 (b) There is a Joint Committee on Children, Youth, and Families. 7 (c) The Committee consists of the following 20 members: from the Senate: 8 **(1)** 9 (i) the majority leader; the minority leader; and 10 (ii) 11 two members from each of the four standing committees; (iii) 12 and 13 from the House: (2)14 (i) the majority leader; 15 the minority leader; and (ii) 16 (iii) eight other Delegates appointed by the Speaker from among the members of the House committees that deal with issues affecting children, youth, 17 and families. 18 19 (d) Members of the Committee shall be appointed on the basis of (1)20 demonstrated ability and interest concerning issues affecting children, youth, and 21 families. 22(2)In making appointments, the President and the Speaker shall 23 provide for representation from: 24 (i) the committees that deal with issues affecting children, 25 youth, and families; and 26 (ii) the major areas of the State. 27(e) **(1)** (i) A member appointed by the President serves at the pleasure 28 of the President.

- 1 (ii) A member appointed by the Speaker serves at the pleasure 2 of the Speaker. 3 If a vacancy occurs among the Senators on the Committee, a 4 successor promptly shall be appointed by the President. 5 (ii) If a vacancy occurs among the Delegates on the Committee, 6 a successor promptly shall be appointed by the Speaker. 7 From among the membership of the Committee, the President **(1)** shall appoint a Senator to serve as the Senate chairman of the Committee and the 8 Speaker shall appoint a Delegate to serve as the House chairman of the Committee. 9 10 (2)The Senate chairman and the House chairman shall alternate 11 annually as presiding chairman and cochairman of the Committee. 12 A majority of the full authorized membership of the Committee is a (g) 13 quorum. 14 The Department of Legislative Services, Office of Policy Analysis, shall 15 provide staff assistance to the Committee. 16 The Committee shall hold: (i) 17 an organizational meeting promptly after the appointment of its (1) 18 members; and 19 (2)any other meetings that the Committee considers necessary to carry out its duties efficiently. 20 21(j) The Committee may: 22 hold a hearing on any matter relating to the functions of the 23 Committee; and 24(2)consider a vote on a bill or resolution referred to it by the President 25or the Speaker. 26 In addition to any powers and duties set forth elsewhere, in an endeavor to achieve conditions of well-being for Maryland children, youth, and families, the 27 28 Committee shall: 29 investigate the problems that jeopardize the well-being of (1)
