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## CHAPTER \_\_\_\_\_

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Joint Committee on Children, Youth, and Families – Repeal of Sunset**

3 FOR the purpose of repealing the termination date of the Acts that established the  
4 Joint Committee on Children, Youth, and Families; and generally relating to  
5 the Joint Committee on Children, Youth, and Families.

6 BY repealing and reenacting, without amendments,  
7 Article – State Government

19 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF  
20 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

1 **Article – State Government**

2 2–10A–06.

3 (a) In this section, “conditions of well–being” means the desired results  
4 identified by the Maryland Partnership for Children, Youth, and Families based upon  
5 identified needs and used to improve quality.

6 (b) There is a Joint Committee on Children, Youth, and Families.

7 (c) The Committee consists of the following 20 members:

8 (1) from the Senate:

9 (i) the majority leader;

10 (ii) the minority leader; and

11 (iii) two members from each of the four standing committees;

12 and

13 (2) from the House:

14 (i) the majority leader;

15 (ii) the minority leader; and

16 (iii) eight other Delegates appointed by the Speaker from among  
17 the members of the House committees that deal with issues affecting children, youth,  
18 and families.

19 (d) (1) Members of the Committee shall be appointed on the basis of  
20 demonstrated ability and interest concerning issues affecting children, youth, and  
21 families.

22 (2) In making appointments, the President and the Speaker shall  
23 provide for representation from:

24 (i) the committees that deal with issues affecting children,  
25 youth, and families; and

26 (ii) the major areas of the State.

27 (e) (1) (i) A member appointed by the President serves at the pleasure  
28 of the President.

1 (ii) A member appointed by the Speaker serves at the pleasure  
2 of the Speaker.

3 (2) (i) If a vacancy occurs among the Senators on the Committee, a  
4 successor promptly shall be appointed by the President.

5 (ii) If a vacancy occurs among the Delegates on the Committee,  
6 a successor promptly shall be appointed by the Speaker.

7 (f) (1) From among the membership of the Committee, the President  
8 shall appoint a Senator to serve as the Senate chairman of the Committee and the  
9 Speaker shall appoint a Delegate to serve as the House chairman of the Committee.

10 (2) The Senate chairman and the House chairman shall alternate  
11 annually as presiding chairman and cochairman of the Committee.

12 (g) A majority of the full authorized membership of the Committee is a  
13 quorum.

14 (h) The Department of Legislative Services, Office of Policy Analysis, shall  
15 provide staff assistance to the Committee.

16 (i) The Committee shall hold:

17 (1) an organizational meeting promptly after the appointment of its  
18 members; and

19 (2) any other meetings that the Committee considers necessary to  
20 carry out its duties efficiently.

21 (j) The Committee may:

22 (1) hold a hearing on any matter relating to the functions of the  
23 Committee; and

24 (2) consider a vote on a bill or resolution referred to it by the President  
25 or the Speaker.

26 (k) In addition to any powers and duties set forth elsewhere, in an endeavor  
27 to achieve conditions of well-being for Maryland children, youth, and families, the  
28 Committee shall:

29 (1) investigate the problems that jeopardize the well-being of  
30 Maryland children, youth, and families;

31 (2) identify State policies and actions that, in conjunction with public  
32 and private partners and in support of families and communities, can work to achieve  
33 conditions of well-being for Maryland children, youth, and families;

1 (3) review and make recommendations to align State statutes,  
2 regulations, programs, services, and budgetary priorities with the State policies and  
3 actions described in paragraph (2) of this subsection;

4 (4) search for any interdepartmental gaps, inconsistencies, and  
5 inefficiencies in the implementation or attainment of the State policies and actions  
6 described in paragraph (2) of this subsection;

7 (5) identify any new laws, regulations, programs, services, and  
8 budgetary priorities that are needed to ensure and promote desired conditions of  
9 well-being for Maryland children, youth, and families;

10 (6) serve as an informational resource for the Senate and the House on  
11 legislative policy matters concerning children, youth, and families; and

12 (7) perform other activities, including improving public awareness of  
13 the special needs of Maryland children, youth, and families.

14 (1) (1) Subject to § 2-1246 of this title, the Committee shall submit an  
15 annual report to the General Assembly on or before December 1 of each year.

16 (2) The report shall include:

17 (i) a description of the work of the Committee; and

18 (ii) any recommendations of the Committee.
