Disease Prevention - Cancer Reports - Myelodysplastic Syndromes

- FOR the purpose of requiring certain hospitals, laboratories, ambulatory care 3 facilities, radiological centers, and health care practitioners to submit certain 4 5 reports, make certain information available, or enter into certain agreements 6 with certain hospitals; adding certain syndromes to the diagnoses required to be 7 reported in a cancer report; authorizing the Secretary of Health and Mental 8 Hygiene or the Secretary's agent to inspect certain medical records of certain patients under certain circumstances; making a certain stylistic change; 9 defining a certain term; and generally relating to the reporting of 10 myelodysplastic syndromes. 11

- (5) "MDS" MEANS MYELODYSPLASTIC SYNDROMES, FORMERLY KNOWN AS PRELEUKEMIA, WHICH ARE A GROUP OF BONE MARROW DISORDERS THAT ARE MARKED BY AN ABNORMAL REDUCTION IN ONE OR MORE TYPES OF CIRCULATING BLOOD CELLS.
- (b) (1) Each hospital which has care of a patient with [cancer] MDS, CANCER, or a central nervous system tumor, each freestanding laboratory, freestanding ambulatory care facility, or therapeutic radiological center which has care of or has diagnosed [cancer] MDS, CANCER, or a central nervous system tumor for a nonhospitalized patient, and each physician who has care of or has diagnosed [cancer] MDS, CANCER, or a central nervous system tumor for a nonhospitalized patient not otherwise reported shall:
- 14 (i) 1. Submit a cancer report to the Secretary, on the form 15 that the Secretary provides or in a computerized file;
- 16 2. Make available to the Secretary, or an agent of the Secretary, at the facility the information necessary to compile a cancer report; or
 - 3. Enter into an agreement with a hospital or other facility or agency that agrees to report to the Maryland Cancer Registry to act as the reporting source for a [cancer] PATIENT WHO HAS MDS, CANCER, or A central nervous system tumor [patient] who has been referred to or from that facility, or reported to that agency with regard to [cancer] MDS, CANCER, or central nervous system tumor screening, diagnosis, or treatment; and
 - (ii) Effective July 1, 1993, submit a cancer report in a computerized file on a quarterly basis to the Secretary, or an agent of the Secretary, for all patients initially diagnosed, treated, or admitted to a facility for [cancer] MDS, CANCER, or a central nervous system tumor during that calendar quarter.
 - (2) To assure compliance with this section, the Secretary, or an agent of the Secretary, may inspect upon reasonable notice a representative sample of the medical records of patients diagnosed, treated, or admitted for [cancer] **MDS**, **CANCER**, or a central nervous system tumor at the facility.
- 32 (3) (i) Information obtained under this subsection shall be 33 confidential and subject to Title 4, Subtitle 1 of this article.
- 34 (ii) This subsection does not apply to a disclosure by the 35 Secretary to another governmental agency performing its lawful duties pursuant to 36 State or federal law where the Secretary determines that the agency to whom the 37 information is disclosed will maintain the confidentiality of the disclosure.

$1\\2\\3$	(iii) A cancer report is not a medical record under Title 4, Subtitle 3 of this article, but is subject to the confidentiality requirements of Title 4, Subtitle 1 of this article.		
4 5 6 7	(4) Each hospital, freestanding laboratory, freestanding ambulatory care facility, therapeutic radiological center, or physician who in good faith submits a cancer report to the Secretary is not liable in any cause of action arising from the submission of the report.		
8 9 10 11	(5) The Secretary, after consultation with the Cancer Registry Advisory Committee, the Maryland Hospital Association, and representatives of freestanding laboratories and therapeutic radiological centers, shall adopt regulations to implement the requirements of this section.		
12 13 14 15	(6) The Secretary, in accordance with § 2–1246 of the State Government Article, shall submit an annual report to the Governor and General Assembly on the activities of the cancer registry, including utilization of cancer registry data.
