Senate Bill 216 (Senator Simonaire, et al.)

Education, Health, and Environmental Affairs Health and Government Operations

State Government - Commemorative Day - Young Heroes Day

This bill requires the Governor to annually proclaim the first Monday of October as Young Heroes Day. "Young hero" means a minor who is recognized by the residents of the State for the positive contribution the minor has made to society.

Fiscal Summary

State Effect: Commemorating Young Heroes Day does not affect State finances.

Local Effect: None.

Small Business Effect: None.

Analysis

Current Law: Six official commemorative days and two months are recognized in State law as shown in **Exhibit 1**. The Governor also must issue a proclamation each year encouraging citizens and other individuals to observe a moment of silence at 3 p.m. on Memorial Day to unite in remembrance and commemorate the heroic acts and efforts of Marylanders who have served and died in the U.S. armed forces.

Background: Young heroes are young people who have inspired and enriched the lives of others through such actions as community service, courageous acts, and leadership efforts. Commemoration of Young Heroes Day may help Marylanders learn more about and recognize the achievements of young heroes, their role in history, and their everyday impact.
