Task Force to Incorporate the Principles of Universal Design for Learning into the Policies, Practices, and Curriculum of the Education Systems in Maryland

- 5 FOR the purpose of establishing the Task Force to Incorporate the Principles of 6 Universal Design for Learning into the Policies, Practices, and Curriculum of 7 the Education Systems in Maryland; providing for the membership, purposes, 8 and staffing of the Task Force; prohibiting a member of the Task Force from 9 receiving compensation but entitling members to certain reimbursement for 10 certain expenses under certain regulations in the State budget; requiring the 11 Task Force to study and make certain recommendations on how to incorporate 12 and apply the principles of Universal Design for Learning into the policies, 13 practices, and curriculum of the education systems in Maryland; requiring the Task Force to submit a report to the State Board of Education and certain 14 15 committees of the General Assembly on or before a certain date; providing for 16 the termination of this Act; and generally relating to the Task Force to 17 Incorporate the Principles of Universal Design for Learning into the Policies, Practices, and Curriculum of the Education Systems in Maryland. 18
