4 FOR the purpose of requiring the Board of Public Works to adopt regulations that $\mathbf{5}$ require the agency designated to certify minority business enterprises to 6 complete its review and provide notice of its decision to the applicant, absent 7extenuating circumstances, within a certain period of time; authorizing the 8 agency to extend a certain notification requirement for a certain period of time if the agency provides the applicant with a certain notice and explanation; and 9 generally relating to review and notice concerning an application for 10 11 certification as a minority business enterprise.
