A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Creation of a State Debt – Maryland Consolidated Capital Bond Loan of 2010,**
3 **and the Maryland Consolidated Capital Bond Loans of 2003, 2004, 2005, 2006,**
4 **2007, 2008, and 2009**

5 FOR the purpose of authorizing the creation of a State Debt in the amount of One
6 Billion, Seventeen Million, Five Hundred Seventy Five Thousand Dollars
7 (\$1,017,575,000), the proceeds to be used for certain necessary building,
8 construction, demolition, planning, renovation, conversion, replacement, and
9 capital equipment purchases of this State, for acquiring certain real estate in
10 connection therewith, and for grants to certain subdivisions and other
11 organizations for certain development and improvement purposes, subject to the
12 requirement that certain grantees provide and expend certain matching funds
13 by certain dates; providing generally for the issuance and sale of bonds
14 evidencing the loan; authorizing the creation of State Debt to be issued in 2011,
15 the proceeds to be used for certain purposes; authorizing the creation of State
16 Debt to be issued in 2012, the proceeds to be used for certain purposes; imposing
17 a certain tax on all assessable property in the State; requiring that certain
18 grantees convey certain easements under certain circumstances to the
19 Maryland Historical Trust; authorizing certain unexpended appropriations in
20 certain prior capital budgets and bond loans to be expended for other public
21 projects; altering certain requirements for certain programs in certain prior
22 capital budgets and bond loans; providing that the authorizations of State Debt
23 in certain prior capital budgets and bond loans be reduced by certain amounts;
24 providing for certain additional information to be detailed about each project in
25 the capital program; requiring that certain projects be constructed at certain
26 locations; repealing certain requirements for certain appropriations; authorizing
27 premiums from the sale of State bonds in certain fiscal years to remain in or be
28 transferred to a certain fund and to be used for certain capital projects under
29 certain circumstances; requiring the Comptroller to make certain transfers,
30 adjustments, and reconciliations; providing for a delayed effective date for

26 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
27 MARYLAND, That:

28 (1) The Board of Public Works may borrow money and incur indebtedness on
29 behalf of the State of Maryland through a State loan to be known as the Maryland
30 Consolidated Capital Bond Loan of 2010 in the total principal amount of
31 \$1,017,575,000. This loan shall be evidenced by the issuance, sale, and delivery of
32 State general obligation bonds authorized by a resolution of the Board of Public Works
33 and issued, sold, and delivered in accordance with §§ 8–117 through 8–124 of the State
34 Finance and Procurement Article and Article 31, § 22 of the Code.

35 (2) The bonds to evidence this loan or installments of this loan may be sold
36 as a single issue of bonds under § 8–122 of the State Finance and Procurement Article.

37 (3) The cash proceeds of the sale of the bonds shall be paid to the Treasurer
38 and first shall be applied to the payment of the expenses of issuing, selling, and

delivering the bonds, unless funds for this purpose are otherwise provided, and then shall be credited on the books of the Comptroller and expended, on approval by the Board of Public Works, for the following public purposes, including any applicable architects' and engineers' fees:

17 laboratory and office space for the Department of Physics, the
18 Department of Astronomy, and the Institute for Physical
19 Sciences and Technology (Prince George's County) 10,600,000

20 (4) An annual State tax is imposed on all assessable property in the State in
21 rate and amount sufficient to pay the principal and interest on the bonds as and when
22 due and until paid in full. The principal shall be discharged within 15 years after the
23 date of the issuance of the bonds.

24 (5) The proceeds of these loans must be expended or encumbered by the
25 Board of Public Works for the purposes provided in this Act no later than June 1,
26 2019. If any funds authorized by this Act remain unexpended or unencumbered after
27 June 1, 2019, the amount of the unencumbered or unexpended authorization shall be
28 canceled and be of no further effect. If bonds have been issued for these loans, the
29 amount of unexpended or unencumbered bond proceeds shall be disposed of as
30 provided in § 8–129 of the State Finance and Procurement Article.

31 SECTION 14. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That:

32 (1) Notwithstanding § 8–125(e) of the State Finance and Procurement
33 Article, up to \$53,297,000 in premiums from the sale of State general obligation bonds
34 in 2010 shall remain in the State and Local Facilities Loan Fund and, on approval by
35 the Board of Public Works, may be expended only by the Comptroller to provide fiscal

year 2011 grants for public school construction projects approved by the Interagency Committee for School Construction.

(2) The Comptroller shall make any transfers or accounting adjustments to implement the provisions of this Section.

SECTION 15. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the net new debt to be authorized by legislation in fiscal year 2011 may not exceed \$1,140,000,000, as evidenced by the following:
