- (i) Is stationed in this State;
- (ii) <u>Resides in this State; or</u>
- (iii) Is domiciled in this State;

(2) The honorably discharged veteran presents [the following documentation] EVIDENCE THAT THE VETERAN WAS HONORABLY DISCHARGED within [1 year] 4 YEARS after the veteran's discharge[:

(i) <u>Evidence that the veteran attended a public or private</u> secondary school in this State for at least 3 years; and

(ii) Documentation that the veteran graduated from a public or private secondary school in this State or received the equivalent of a high school diploma in this State]; or

(3) The National Guard member described in subsection (a)(5) of this section is a member of the Maryland National Guard and joined or subsequently serves in the Maryland National Guard to:

(i) <u>Provide a Critical Military Occupational Skill; or</u>

(ii) <u>Be a member of the Air Force Critical Specialty Code as</u> <u>determined by the National Guard.</u>".
